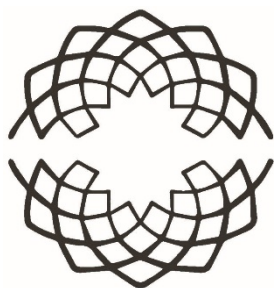

This program prepares educators to make innovative contributions to world language education as teachers, leaders, and researchers.

### FLEXIBLE PROGRAM

- Traditional track for daytime students
- Professional track with evening and summer classes for practicing teachers

### PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS: 33 hours

- Course work (27 hours)
- Project or thesis (6 hours)
- Intermediate level proficiency in a second foreign language
- Written specialty exam covering readings and coursework

### SPECIAL FEATURES

- Access to graduate faculty in Spanish Pedagogy, Hispanic Linguistics, Hispanic Literatures, and Spanish Translation
- One-week mini-courses taught by visiting professors from around the country
- State-of-the-art facilities and labs

### TUITION & FINANCIAL AID

- Estimated tuition for two years (2019-2020 rates): \$14,580 for LDS candidates; \$29,160 for non-LDS
- Typical scholarships: 50-80% of LDS tuition for students who teach a 100-level or 200-level Spanish or Portuguese course
- Paid teaching assistantships available for all interested students
